#### **Amalgamation**

## **Notional Allocation Funding**

Paul Brown noted that the representative for Hamilton Hall had indicated that he would still like to have a heat pump installed.

It was moved by Trent Caseley and seconded by Paul Brown that the Community of Malpeque Bay approve the following standard form Agreement to be made with not for profit groups for which the Community of Malpeque Bay is providing Notional Allocation Capital Investment Plan Project Funding support. **Motion Carried**
